What do mentors do?

What do mentors do? Academic mentors will work to support a peer mentor (senior doctoral student or post-doc with experience in KT) to support groups of 5-6 learners in a case study. The case study groups will be partnered with real-life knowledge-to-action challenges. Ideally, mentors will have relationships in partner countries or settings where they can support connections and communications to pressing issues, where contributions from students in this course will be in service to a real need.

Course Format

Learners will need about 10-12 hours per week to engage in course readings and activities. We will meet weekly, using dialogue-based learning strategies. Groups of 5-6 learners will work with a peer mentor and academic mentor to apply practices to a real-life knowledge-to action challenge in a variety of partner communities in Canada and the Global South.

- Week 9: Priority Setting: The Basics
- Week 10: Interpretive Priority Setting Processes
- Week 11: Final Case Study Review
- Week 12: Course Evaluation and Closings
